#### Parents' Evening:

It was wonderful that so many of you booked an appointment to meet with your child's class teacher(s) so early in the term. We do hope you found the sessions useful. Thank you for your support in helping us ensure that your child continues to flourish at our school.

Next week the EYFS Team will be running a workshop for parents of children in Reception to introduce you to our Phonics scheme and guide you in supporting your child at home with reading. An invitation to attend the virtual meeting which will be on Google Meet will be posted early next week.

In school, we place a heavy emphasis on growth mindset so having patience and determination to put one foot in front of the other to start a daunting journey illustrated what can be achieved.

We thought about the fact that they don't disappear but they aren't in control; we can see them more clearly, we can name them and we can leave them there. When we can see other things more clearly, we can see ourselves, others, our world and even God if we are open to him. In a world where anxiety is more prevalent, messages like this become increasingly important and help everyone on their spiritual journey.

This week a number of classes enjoyed virtual visits to the Henley Literary Festival. They heard from authors and had the chance to pose questions. We do hope your child spoke positively about the experience. Year 4 also marked National Poetry Day with an online session with poet and author Simon Mole. They had great fun learning from him.

On the 23rd and 24th September Leo competed at the Utilita Arena in Birmingham at the British Gymnastics Regional Challenge Cup Finals representing the South of England. Leo put out some amazing tumbling and after a nail biting wait he won the Bronze medal placing him 3rd in the United Kingdom. We our immensely proud of Leo's achievement and we wish him every success in future events.
