After the week we'd previously had, it has been lovely to see some normality this week. I hope the return of clubs and wrap around care has helped you manage child care arrangements and been something the children have also welcomed. Drawing on our Vision:

Last week I was lucky enough to attend the Institution and Induction Service, led by the Bishop of Reading and Archdeacon of Berkshire, to welcome Revd Stephen Mills to the parish in his new role as vicar. He led his first service at Holy Trinity Church on Sunday which was extremely well attended and full of warmth and greetings.

As you may remember, we were asked by the church wardens to be part of the recruitment process which led to ten of our Year 6 children interviewing the candidates. Now his appointment has been secured, we have spoken about Stephen in assembly and considered how he might be feeling as he takes up his new job. We have prayed for him and David and are excited about welcoming him to our school in the near future. As you may have seen from our recent SIAMS inspection report, sent today as an attachment, the second of our two development points is 'to continue to grow the current strong partnership with Holy Trinity Church when the new incumbent is in place' so with Father Stephen here we can now begin the work.

This week in school the children have continued to support each other in a whole host of ways during lessons and beyond. School has felt busy and productive. We enjoyed Mr. Simmonds leading assembly on Tuesday when he spoke about Epiphany, and other activities which enrich the learning experience have resumed now the flood waters have gone. Lots of our musicians enjoyed seeing Ben from Rock Steady on Wednesday when Paul from CultureMix was also in delivering a steel pan lesson to Year 6. Year 4 are making great progress on their dance routine ahead of their performance at the borough's dance festival next month and we were delighted that gymnast Olivia was able to come in on two days this week which now means that every child in the school has had the opportunity to work with her. Dan, the hockey coach from Borlase has also been in. It's great to be functioning normally again.
