#### Drawing on our Vision:

After the work we did last week, perhaps your child has told you that Snapper now takes pride of place on our Christmas tree as a reminder to us all of how important it is to be inclusive and kind. He has become a really special part of our community!

This week we were thrilled to welcome to school Richard Simmonds, a Lay Minister at Holy Trinity Church. He spoke to the children about Advent and since them we have thought more about this important time in the church's calendar. Today, having spoken about its significance, we lit the first candle in our Advent wreath. Christmas trees are going up, Nativity scenes are out and today elves have been creating mischief in classrooms; excitement is certainly building.

That said, we have used our time in Collective Worship to reflect on the meaning of Christmas and how the light of our Advent wreath reminds us of the light God brings to the world. Year 6 had a fantastic session today with Wayne Dixon of Christian Connections in School. He came to deliver his 'Christmas Unwrapped' workshop and had the children looking at Biblical texts to unravel the facts and myths around the Christmas story. He did a fabulous job engaging and inspiring the children.

With Christmas on the horizon, our Partners for Change ambassadors have now launched our next fundraising project. Starting on Monday our Christmas Post Office will be open every day at lunchtime in the library. Your child is invited to use our internal delivery service to send Christmas cards to their friends at a cost of a penny per card. If they choose to do so, please help them to write the full name of the child the card is for on the front and the year group they are in so our post men and women know exactly where to deliver it. In the post office there will also be a stall with different stock in each day. These stalls have been organised by the children who have made things to sell and who are keen to do their bit to support the charity. Each day a different group will be setting up a stall so your child might like to bring in a small amount of pocket money, no more than a £1 to make a purchase. Stock is limited but there should be enough time between now and the end of term for everyone to find something they like.

There will be buckets to drop lose change in after each of our Nativity performances next week so we thank you in advance for helping us support the charity and making a difference to the lives of children in Ethiopia. # Attendance:

Following a meeting with the attendance lead in the borough, Education Welfare Officers and several other head teachers on Wednesday I'd like to share a link with you to an NHS website which I was shown and which I feel could be incredibly useful for you. It shows common illness in children offering advise on what to do if they show symptoms. To find out what it's all about go to:

Attendance at school is compulsory unless a child is poorly so requests for holidays even if it's just one day out, should not be made; they cannot be granted. As I'm sure you can appreciate, any time away from the classroom is incredibly disruptive. A lesson missed puts a pupil at a disadvantage especially when that lesson falls within a sequence of planned learning activities. With the DfE requiring schools to place a greater focus on attendance, we now have an allocated Education Welfare Officer who comes to school on a regular basis to check attendance registers. Poor attendance could trigger a visit from her. We are committed to working with you to provide the best possible learning experience for all the children so we rely on your support in this matter. Thank you.

# SIAMS Inspection:

I trust you are in receipt of my email informing you that next Thursday, because we are a Church of England school, we will be receiving a visit from an inspector who will be carrying out a Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools.
