

# **KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK**

If you were able to attend this week's PTA meeting, thank you for giving up your time. It was a productive meeting during which a number of plans were made for upcoming events. Please refer to the calendar below for what these are and what other things are happening as we venture towards the Summer Term.

## Drawing on our Vision and News from Around the School:

The week began on a positive note for Year 6 who spent Monday morning working with the Learning to Work team on a 'Heathrow Explorers' project. During the session the children were free to let their imagination run wild as they explored and designed new modes of transport fit for the future. The focus was on sustainability and innovation while at the same time learning what it is like to work at an airport. The children were supported in small teams to use 3D design software while developing skills of teamwork, communication, problem solving, creative thinking and adaptability. The Learning to Work team was incredibly impressed by the children's designs and presentations which they were able to put together in a relatively short space of time.

On Monday we were also delighted to welcome friend and colleague, Carol Pearce to Holy Trinity. She came bearing gifts from the Lions Club of Maidenhead. Our Eco-Council received from her seven beautiful books each focusing on different environmental issues. They hope to use the messages in the book to guide them in future school eco-projects.

Year 3's trip to the Henley River and Rowing Museum yesterday also had an environmental theme. The children enjoyed a Wind in the Willows workshop and a meadow walk around the site. It was a fabulous way to conclude their study of Kenneth Grahame's famous book.

Making the most of the spring weather we've been having, Cygnet Class took to the field for a Little Muddy Boots workshop yesterday afternoon. The purpose of the session was to think about what can be grown at home and locally ahead of us planting and growing in a wheelbarrow which will be entered into the schools' competition at this year's Royal Windsor Flower Show. Look out for more news about this in the coming weeks.

Today your child has brought home a packet of seeds given to them by WildCookham. Please refer to the packet for details of what they should do with their seeds to support the group ahead of The Big Cookham Wildlife Weekend. They come with the following message from WildCookham's Brian Clews (brian.clews@btconnect.com):

As spring has officially arrived, WildCookham is making final arrangements for the big garden safari opportunity on June 22nd and 23rd, when we hope as many households as possible in the Cookhams will take part in finding out how many different creatures and plants you can discover in your gardens.

We have been suggesting a pond be added and have a 30-page booklet to help create and maintain one so do get in touch if you would like one delivered. But also we have given each child at the four primary schools a packet of wildflower seed, just enough for a one square metre patch, with instructions how to prepare the ground beforehand. We would be grateful if you could encourage them in creating this additional habitat during the break which hopefully by summer will be attracting even more insect species into our gardens.

The packet contents are known as the Adrian Doble Seed Mix, in remembrance of our Cookham friend Adrian who did so much for many decades for bees and other pollinating insects.

As Easter is a time in which to be even more thankful for the Creation, we hope as many of us as possible can help achieve the most naturefriendly village we can.

### Sporting News:

It was disappointing that our football match against Holyport was postponed this week but the squad was delighted that their games against White Waltham went ahead at the start of the week especially given the scores. Both the A and the B team stormed to victory in two extremely exciting games which were watched by a number of spectators.
