

# **KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK**

Welcome to the start of a new term. We hope your child has enjoyed being back, seeing their friends and embarking on new topics, details of which can be found on the curriculum letters we sent out in January. We have had an excellent week in school despite, on occasions, the weather preventing us from going out at playtime. Everyone has been working productively and we are proud of what the children have already achieved. It promises to be a successful term.

### Drawing on our Vision and News from Around the School:

I was delighted to welcome Reverend Stephen Mills to school yesterday. Stephen has only recently taken up his post as vicar of the Cookham Benefice but already he has shown a genuine interest in getting to know our community. You may remember that some of our Year 6 children were involved in the interview process so there was great excitement, particularly from those who had met him before, when I showed him around school in the morning. He will be coming again on 12<sup>th</sup> March to see Collective Worship after which we hope he will be a regular visitor.

In other news this week many of the children have embarked on new RE topics all of which relate to Lent or the Easter story. Year 5 will be considering the question, 'Was the death of Jesus a worthwhile sacrifice' so to launch the study, in their first lesson they created tableaus to reflect the events which led up to the crucifixion. Combining drama with RE really helped to cement the story. Swans have also been inspired by the story of The Great Fire of London. During Book Week an author, Kate Cunningham who has written a book 'Vlad and The Great Fire of London', will be coming in to talk to them. Listen out for news of bucket chains being used to put out a fire.

Year 6 have continued their study of Michael Morpurgo's 'War Horse'. The focus for their Big Write was to create a narrative in which direct speech played a significant part. Some of the writing they compiled was superb. 'Wind in the Willows', which will be the focus for our joint venture with the other Cookham schools during this year's Cookham Festival, is the text that Year 3 are continuing to use in English this term. In a lesson which really captured their imagination, the children took part in a courtroom debate presenting arguments to the judge to persuade him to send Mr Toad to prison. Because of the excellent points put forward, he was convicted but with a slightly reduced sentence to that originally proposed!

Year 2 took a break in the rain to walk around the village this morning. They used the maps they had compiled from aerial images to find their way, spotting human and physical features as they went. Cygnets also made use of the outdoors, drawing the solar system in chalk on the playground. It was lovely that so many were keen to bring you round the back of the site to show you their pictures. At some point Year 4 will also be hoping to go outside to test the model cars they will be making this term. They are only at the design stage but already they have come up with some great ideas as to how to power them. We'll be checking in on their progress in the coming weeks.

### Book Week – Monday 4th to Friday 8th March:

If you missed recent information about Book Week, it runs from 4<sup>th</sup> to the 8<sup>th</sup> March to coincide with World Book Day on 7<sup>th</sup> March. We have lots of events planned which are sure to interest the children. Today you have been sent a leaflet about author, comic and actor Andrew Clover coming to school. It explains how you can pre-order any one of his books ahead of his visit on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> march. Do take a look.

Chantal at the Little Bookshop has also set up a page on her website where you can buy a range of books linked to the events we have planned and the authors who will be visiting. When Year 5 and Year 6 go to the book shop they will be meeting author Nicki Thornton to learn about her book, 'The Floating Witch Mystery'. If you child would like Nicki to sign a book for them, then pre-ordering from the website is essential to ensure enough books are in stock in to avoid disappointment.

We will end the week with a dress-up day when everyone is invited to come to school dressed as a book character. The Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead Libraries are hosting a 'World Book Day Costume Swap' event for children in the Borough at Cookham, Dedworth, Maidenhead and Windsor Library. The premise of the event is to encourage people to bring in and donate their children's old fancy dress costumes, and in return take another costume that has been donated away with them for free. This should reduce the amount of costumes going to landfill and allow children to dress up for World Book Day, without the financial burden of buying new costumes during the current cost of living crisis.
