### Attendance:

It will, of course, be no surprise to you to hear that regular attendance is an essential part of your child's learning journey. While we understand that there are genuine reasons, notably illness, which mean it is not appropriate to send your child to school, any time away from the classroom is incredibly disruptive. A lesson missed puts a pupil at a disadvantage especially when that lesson falls within a sequence of planned learning activities. In order to comply with government regulations and the expectations of the Department for Education, 95% or above is the target schools always strive for.

I am delighted to inform you that 95 pupils achieved 100% attendance last term. Their achievement was celebrated today in assembly.
