Drawing on our Vision and News from Around the School:

You may be aware that this week has been Children's Mental Health Week. Children's Mental Health Week is a mental health awareness week that empowers, equips and gives a voice to all children and young people in the UK. It was launched in 2015 and each year, hundreds of schools, children, parents and carers take part. Now in its 10th year, the theme this time round has been '*My Voice Matters*'.

Throughout the week, in class and in assemblies, we have tackled some of the issues around this important topic in the hope that the children feel empowered to work together to create a positive change for their mental health and wellbeing. Attendance:

As we approach the end of another term, in case you missed the information in last week's newsletter, I want to remind you that attendance at school is compulsory unless a child is poorly. Requests for holidays, even if it's just one day, should not be made; I am not permitted to grant them. Absence because a holiday has been taken goes down on a child's record as an unauthorised absence. These unauthorised absences are scrutinised by the school's Education Welfare Officer who meets with me on a regular basis and who requests meetings with parents when attendance becomes a concern.

As I'm sure you can appreciate, any time away from the classroom is incredibly disruptive. A lesson missed puts a pupil at a disadvantage especially when that lesson falls within a sequence of planned learning activities. You may be interested to read findings from some DfE research, published in 2022, which highlights the link between absence and attainment at KS2 and KS4.

Wraparound care is before and after school childcare for primary school aged children. The Wraparound Childcare Programme aims to increase the availability of wraparound childcare places, so that all families can access childcare between 8am-6pm and therefore allow parents to continue, or enter employment.
