Supporting your child with Reading:

All Class Newsletters explain the importance of reading and the value of you reading with your child on a daily basis. We appreciate how tricky this can be and are grateful for any support you can give. We see how much the children enjoy reading with an adult and the reward it brings. It is always our aim to promote a love of reading in our children which is why our annual Book Week is so important. This year is runs from 2nd to 6th March with a dress up day on the Friday.

The start of a new year is maybe a time to consider subscribing to a weekly/ monthly publication. There are lots of excellent publications out there specifically for children which cater for a whole range of interests.

Safety Drills:

You may have heard from your child that this week we have carried out fire and lockdown drills. Both are important for our safeguarding practice and are carried out regularly to ensure that pupils and staff are familiar with procedures. National Child Measuring Programme (NCMP):

Every year in England, school children in Reception and Year 6 have their height and weight checked at school. This is called the National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP). The checks are carried out by the School Health Team. This will be taking place in our school this term. If you have a child in Reception you will have already been emailed two documents about this programme which have also been sent out to you today as attachments.

Lost Property:

We end the first week with virtually no lost property. Thank you for continuing to check that all clothing items and school equipment that your child brings into school remains clearly named. We are very grateful. Non-named items will again this term be placed on the wooden posts outside our Year 2 classroom for a short period before being disposed of.

Given that I received a leaflet from the borough this week that all head teachers have been asked to send out to parents, this is clearly an issue that many schools face. I wonder if this term we can all do our bit to ensure that no further complaints are made. RBWM's 'School Drop-Off and Pick-Up Safety' notice has been sent to you today as an attachment. Please take a moment to read it.

Finally, I end this week's newsletter looking back to the Crib Service held at Holy Trinity Church on Christmas Eve. Unfortunately, I was unable to attend as I was away visiting family.
