


KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK

How You Can Help your Child Manage the Routines of the Day and Access Learning:

Last week's newsletter offered some suggestions as to how you can help your child at home. Hopefully you also picked up some tips in our 'Meet the Teacher' meetings all of which will have mentioned reading. Whatever stage your child is at, whether in Reception Class or Year 6, reading with your child can have an enormous impact on their learning. Finding time each day to hear your child read or to read to them is a wonderful way to support them in accessing all areas of the curriculum.

Buckinghamshire 11+ Transfer Tests:

This week a number of children have taken 11+ familiarisation and transfer tests. The ability to read accurately and draw information from texts was a focus. The children worked incredibly hard and with tremendous focus; we were proud of them all.

Papers are marked externally with results returned directly to you in October.

Nut Free/ Sesame Free:

As you are aware, we have a very strict No Nut, No Sesame policy. Because of the severe reactions certain children at our school have when exposed to these products, even food items which indicate 'might contain nut', cannot be brought into school. Please take note and be vigilant.

Heritage Open Days at Holy Trinity Church, Cookham:

Heritage Open Days, England's largest festival of history and Culture running from 12th-21st September, is coming to Cookham. Holy Trinity Church will be open for visitors. The designs they produced will be on display in the church so do take a moment to pop in and see their creations.
