Arts and Culture Week:

Arthur Burgin Science Exhibition:

On Wednesday afternoon parents of Year 6 children are invited into school at 2:15pm to see the work Year 6 has carried out over the last couple of weeks. The children have worked independently on a science investigation of their choice, carrying out experiments to determine the answer to a specific question they have decided upon themselves. In line with tradition, the most promising and competent scientist will be presented with the Arthur Burgin trophy on which their name will be etched. This is a most prestigious award which is named after a long serving Chair of Governors at Holy Trinity School. We do hope you will be able to attend.

Transition Days:

As we usually do, we have planned a couple of days of transition so that the children can get used to a new classroom before September. This will happen on Tuesday 24th June and Wednesday 25th June. On these two days, all the children should arrive in the morning at the back gate ready to walk round to their new classroom.
