

KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK

We hope you have enjoyed the events this week which we feel have rounded off the year successfully. Thank you for taking time to visit your child's class in our Open House event and for coming along to Sports Day yesterday. We were so pleased that the weather held and that so many of you were able to attend. We also loved having a number of former pupils, some of whom have been with us during the week on work experience, helping out. We hope that those of you who came to our Spanish assembly and Rock Steady concert also welcomed the chance to see the children perform.

It has been another extremely busy but successful term at Holy Trinity and we hope your child has enjoyed all the things they have learnt and the experiences they have had, many of which have been captured in photographs posted on Google Classroom. Today your child will have brought home completed exercise books for you to keep and them to treasure. They will also have come home with their school report. For some year groups you will also receive in the report results related to Early Year Goals, Phonics Screening, Year 4 Multiplication Check and Key Stage 2 Standard Attainment Tests (SATs). Please note, Key Stage 1 SATs results are not reported to parents as they form only one piece of evidence in a much wider bank of evidence used to determine TA at the end of KS1.

This week we received our Year 6 SATs results which show that our school has performed significantly better than schools nationally. We are immensely proud of the children and their achievements. Attainment across the school is excellent and an indication of how motivated and engaged the children are in their learning.

Leavers' Assembly:

On Monday, parents of Year 6 children are invited to a Leavers' Service at school at 9:30am. Year 6 children should come to school in full school uniform on that day.

Following the service, there will be an opportunity for the child to sign each other's shirts. In order to do this, they should bring in a spare shirt and felt tip pens. We look forward to ensuring their last day at Holy Trinity School is a special one.
