It was a wonderful day out during which the curriculum was magically brought to life.

Cookham Abbey Archaeological Dig:

You may recall that last year we received a visit from the team involved in the archaeological dig in the village. They spoke to all the children in assembly about their work and then spent time with our current Year 5 pupils exploring further. Maths & Computing Week:

Next week we embark on our second themed week of the year, Maths and Computing Week, which many of you have signed up to join us for. Thank you. All week the focus will be on these specific areas of the curriculum with workshops timetabled which we hope will inspire and motivate. During the week our older children will embark on the Primary Maths Challenge, a mathematics competition for students aged 9-11, designed to foster enthusiasm and problem-solving skills. They have been prepared for this by Mrs Neal and her team who come in every week before school to run maths club. We are enormously grateful to them for giving up their time to inspire the children.

One of the workshops next week will be led by Childnet who will focus on online safety. **You are invited to attend their parent workshop at 7pm on Monday 17th November** during which they will be guiding you on how best to support your child when they are online.

They will speak about:

- Conduct: What children may be doing online, including sharing personal information, screen time, nude image sharing, online reputation and AI
- **Content:** What children may be seeing online, including filtered lives/self-image, upsetting and harmful content, algorithms, online hate and adult content
- Contact: Who children may be speaking to online, including online bullying and group chats, grooming and online sexual harassment
- Commerce: Any risk with a financial or contractual element, including influencers, scams, in-app purchases, and sextortion
- Advice: Discussing three steps, 'Talk, Support, Report'. Including tackling tricky conversations, victim blaming, how to manage privacy and parental settings, digital wellbeing, reporting, useful websites

There is no need to book a place, simply turn up at the back door of the hall. A letter from Mr. Redjeb about the event is attached again for your convenience.

During the week the children have been set a challenge, to take a photograph of an array which they find at home or out and about. Entries should be uploaded onto Google Classroom by Thursday 20th November. The more creative, the better!
