

KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK

Having now come to the end of the penultimate term of this academic year and as we look forward to the half term break, can I thank you for all your support this term in helping us to ensure it has been a happy and productive one.

This week has been as busy as every other with our Year 2 children taking their KS1 Standard Attainment Tests (SATs) which will form part of our teacher assessment evidence ahead of them moving into Year 3. As Year 6 did last week, they have worked hard showing high levels of concentration and resilience. We are proud of how they have approached the task.

Results from these tests are not reported. Instead they form part of the evidence which allows us to assess the children precisely before they move into Key Stage 2 (KS2). To help you understand the process better, you have been resent the letter first circulated back in October which explains the national testing programme. Here you can also find information about the Y1 Phonics Screening and the Year 4 Multiplication Check. Standards & Testing Agency leaflets have also been sent out again. Teacher assessment for Year 2, along with all other year groups, are reported at the end of the Summer Term as part of our annual reporting arrangements.

Wayne Dixon's 'It's Your Move':

As we get nearer to the end of the academic year, for Year 6 thoughts turn to transition to secondary school. For any child, this jump can be daunting so to help our students prepare for things to come, this week we invited Wayne Dixon from Christian Connections in Schools into the classroom to deliver his workshop, 'It's Your Move'. Wayne comes every year bringing top tips and excellent advice. As a gift, he gave each child a book which we hope will provide all the answers to any questions they may have.

This week we also welcomed colleagues from John Hampden in to speak to us about those children heading there in September. Next term meetings are scheduled with all the secondary schools so we can share information and so that they can meet the children. Over the holiday, if your child is in Year 6, he/she might like to start thinking of questions they might ask when they meet with their new teachers. We have lots in place to ensure a smooth transition so they must take advantage of this..

PTA News

Thank you for your generosity in sending your child into school today with items for our HT Fest tombola. We are looking forward to the event which will be held on Saturday 5th July.

Our PTA Committee does a tremendous job steering us in fund raising which your children directly benefits from. Our new picnic benches outside the Year 3 and Year 4 classrooms, an area we are calling 'The Terrace', and bought by the PTA, have really enhanced the space. As part of our continued work on our Attachment Aware Schools Project, we are aiming to use this area, and the area under the sails on the field, to make a quiet, creative space for children at both break and lunchtime. This was after the children had a look at the plans and offered their opinions. We are now set to go ahead with this project, another supported by our PTA.

Arts and Culture Week:

Creating a Sense of Belonging

Every child needs to feel like they truly **belong**—that they are seen, valued, and accepted for who they are. Belonging is one of the most powerful protective factors for emotional wellbeing and academic success. When children feel they belong, they are more willing to take risks in their learning, persevere through challenges, and engage with school life.

At Holy Trinity, we build belonging by:

- Greeting every child warmly each day—using names, smiles, and connection
- Encouraging children to bring their ideas, interests, and identities into the classroom.
- Celebrating differences and helping children see themselves reflected in books,

How you can support this at home:

- Let your child know they are an important part of your family team—regularly remind them, "You matter. We're so glad you're you."
- Celebrate what makes them unique, especially if they sometimes feel different from others.
- Share stories, family traditions, and favourite memories that connect your child to something bigger than themselves.
- Encourage their friendships and connections with others—arranging playdates, checking in on how relationships are going, and celebrating kind behaviours.

When children feel that they belong—both at school and at home—they're more confident, more resilient, and more ready to reach their full potential.
