Head Lice:

Joshua Reynolds Christmas Card Design Competition:

Joshua Reynolds, local MP who visited our school a week ago, is looking for a budding artist to create a Christmas card for him this year that really captures the essence of Christmas in Maidenhead. The competition is open to children aged 11 and under who live in his constituency. The winning entry will be personally chosen by the MP and will be printed and sent out with Christmas wishes to people across Maidenhead as well as politicians, royalty, and leaders across the world. Entries for the competition should be marked 'Josh Reynold's Christmas Card Competition' and sent to Maidenhead Advertiser, 48 Bell Street, Maidenhead, SL6 1HX.

The suggested size is A5. Designs need to be bold and bright and preferably done in paint, felt tips or crayons as coloured pencils do not reproduce well when printed. Two-dimensional designs are preferred as materials like glitter and cotton wool do not work when printed. Entries should also include the full name, age and school or organisation (such as a cub or brownie pack) of the entrant as well as a parent's name, address and phone number.

The closing date for entries is Tuesday, November 4 with a prize, still to be determined, awarded to the winner. (Last year it was a family ticket to Legoland). Judging will take place soon afterwards, and Mr Reynold's winner will be announced in a future edition of the Advertiser. I do hope your child will get involved.

Finally, after a relatively short amount of time with us, today we say goodbye to Miss Eagles. Miss Eagles has done a wonderful job over the last few months supporting children across the school and she will be dearly missed. She has, however, exciting plans afoot which will take her to far flung places so do join me in thanking her and wishing her well as she embarks on a journey full of adventure.
