The squad came fourth out of eight teams and afterwards were lucky enough to take part in a number of other events including mountain biking, fencing and skipping.

Despite the dreadful weather, our Year 6 rugby team were not put off when it came to travelling over to Freith School for a

rugby match yesterday. Despite a loss of 10-4 and being caked in mud, the team ended in good spirits pleased to have been chosen to represent the school.

I am delighted that so many children have been involved in sporting fixtures this week, this term, this year. It is our aim to involve as many children as possible in activities which get them up and active.
