The children have been working hard, supporting one another and doing all they can to ensure a positive start for everyone.

Thank you again for your support following the incident we experienced on the last day of last term. It is not unheard of for schools to have to carry out lockdown procedures as we did, and the experience showed us that we have everything in place to deal with such incidents when they occur. Yesterday afternoon I was visited by two Thames Valley Police Constables who were following up on the matter. We hope that this news provides you with confidence in our systems and alleviates any anxieties which may still exist.

Celebrating Easter with Father Stephen and Bishop Mary:

I was delighted that so many of you with your children were able to come along to the Easter Sunday service here at Holy Trinity School at the weekend. It was a wonderful opportunity to celebrate this special time of year with the newly appointed Bishop of Reading, Mary Gregory, who chose to spend her very first Easter as Bishop in our parish. She enjoyed meeting the children who equally enjoyed the Easter egg hunt around school! Sunday services starting at 11am at school continue until the church is ready to reopen with all welcome to come along.

Oxfam assembly:

Yesterday, one of the congregation, Barbara Walmsley, was in school speaking to the children in assembly about Oxfam. We learnt all about how, in response to the suffering in Greece during WW2, it started and has since gone from strength to strength. Barbara brought along some old black and white photos of children who benefitted from their work in those early days, very similar to the coloured photos we have received back from Tibase M School in Ethiopia after the children there received our letters and pictures sent last term. It made the significance of the charity work we do very real for our pupils.

Earth Day:

We marked the date with a range of activities and used the opportunity to think again about how we are all going to support our Eco-Council this term to make a difference. News from Miss Buckley about the 'Attachment Aware Schools' Award': How do we support children to meet their potential at Holy Trinity?

s steps to be EMOTION	
Step 1: Be Aware of Emotions	Step 2: Use Emotions to Connect
Step 3: Label the Emotions	Step 4: Communicate Empathy & Understanding

Step 5: Set Limits & Teach Your Child How to Problem Solve As part of the school's journey towards gain our Attachment Aware Schools' Awards, staff have been trained in emotion coaching. Emotion coaching is a technique where you help your child understand and manage their emotions. It involves five key steps:

1) Recognize and validate the child's feelings.

2) Name the emotion they are experiencing.

3) Provide guidance on how to express it appropriately.

4) Help them problem-solve or manage the emotion in a healthy way.

5) Teach that emotions are a normal part of life and everyone experiences them.

By using emotion coaching, you can support your child's emotional growth, reduce outbursts, and strengthen your relationship by showing empathy and understanding.

Emotion coaching is essential for children to reach their academic potential because it helps them manage their emotions in a healthy way, which directly impacts their ability to focus, learn, and interact with others. When children understand and regulate their emotions, they're better equipped to handle challenges, frustration, or anxiety that might arise in a classroom setting.

Emotion coaching teaches them how to stay calm and resilient, which promotes problem-solving, perseverance, and motivation. Moreover, by feeling understood and supported emotionally, children are more likely to engage in school, build positive relationships with peers and teachers, and maintain a growth mindset—key factors for academic success.

Maidenhead's Big Read:

For the past seven years, the organisers of Maidenhead's Big Read have proudly organised authors, illustrators and story tellers to visit schools and put on other local events in celebration of the annual World Book Day. Their aim has always been to support local schools and families in encouraging broader reading habits among Reception to Year 7 students by fostering a passion for reading.

This year's MBR festival was a tremendous success reaching over 5,000 pupils at 25 local schools over a two-week period. We were one of those schools that benefitted. In addition, they attracted nearly 3,000 attendees to the Maidenhead Library (and the 'Once Upon A Bus' event) over a weekend, something they are very proud of. However, the development and delivery of the MBR programme for this year presented significant challenges due to a dwindling MBR committee and funding constraints. They urgently require additional committee members and a team of extra helpers to ensure their ongoing success, without which everything may fold.

Members of the MBR organising group would be happy to meet with anyone interested in getting involved to share more information about the work they do. As a result, they have arranged an open MBR Volunteers Information meeting for Tuesday 20 May 2025, 7.45 till 9 pm, at the Maidenhead Community Centre, 4 Marlow Road, SL6 7HY (free car park at the back). Anyone interested is welcome to attend. Do go along if you can.
