

# **KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK**

It has been another busy and positive week in school with lots going on. Thank you for your support in ferrying children to and from sporting events and getting them prepared for music auditions. Thank you also for your understanding during the disruption yesterday.

### Music Concert – 18<sup>th</sup> May:

Mrs. Laraine Brown is currently busy preparing the children for an evening of music on Thursday the 18th of May here at school from 6.00pm-7.00pm. Auditions took place this week and several children have been selected to perform. It was lovely to see how many were keen to participate and we are sorry if your child is disappointed not to be chosen. We could have had a concert lasting several hours so we had to limit the numbers. If your child hasn't been chosen on this occasion, they are very welcome to speak to their class teacher to arrange a time when they can play their instrument in class instead.

Our two choirs will be singing at this event. Choir is non-selective and although it is too late for your child to join the choir to perform for the music evening, they are very welcome to go along to choir practice so they are part of any future performance. Mrs. Brown is always delighted when new faces turn up. Junior Choir meets at 8am on Tuesday and Senior Choir at 8am on Thursday.

#### **Sporting Opportunities:**

This week a number of girls were in action at football tournaments held at St Pirans. On Tuesday our Year 5 girls went along and managed to play four matches before the rain fell. Out of the matches they played, they scored 9 goals with 3 scored against them. On Wednesday it was the turn of Year 3. This time the weather was kinder to them. They managed to play eight matches back-to-back winning 3, drawing 2 and losing 3. They returned to school the next day full of excitement for having represented the school. This afternoon Year 4 girls return after a successful afternoon, winning 4 out of their 6 matches.

#### Daily Mile:

We do hope that you found the Class Newsletters, sent out to you last week and posted on Google Classroom this week, interesting and informative. As you will have seen, we have planned lots of exciting activities on a range of topics for the children to enjoy before the end of the Summer Term.

Over the last couple of years, we have spent a huge amount of time redesigning our curriculum and we are proud of the learning opportunities we offer the children. We hope they have spoken to you with enthusiasm about some of the newer projects we have lunched and the latest resources we have introduced to support the learning. The curriculum is vast and with our themed weeks included, five in total over the course of a year, we work tirelessly to ensure everything is covered. We also recognise the value of enhancing our curriculum and providing wider development for the pupils. In order to do this, we have ensured trips form part of our curriculum offer, that there are a range of extra-curricular activities for the pupils to access and that when there are opportunities for the pupils to participate in music festivals, sporting events, Bake-Off competitions, sleep workshops and charity initiatives, for instance, there is no restriction on them doing so.

Because there is so much to cover, it has not been so easy to ensure the daily mile is covered. The weather also restricts us getting outside so we have decided to change the name to the 'fitness mile' to better reflect how we use our running track.

The benefits of getting active and running the fitness mile are not in dispute and we aim to use the track as often as we can. Our weekly P.E. lessons, the additional sporting fixtures we enter and our Sports Fortnight in the summer mean we exceed the requirements of the P.E. National Curriculum but we don't want to restrict those children who love running the mile so we have come up with what we feel is a great idea which we hope you support too.

This term you are invited to use the running track down on the field when you come to collect your child at the end of the day. You can either run the mile (5 times round the track) with them or you can supervise them running it. The only thing we ask is that you supervise your own children (staff will not be available to do so) and that the field is used purely for running the mile. To allow you to do this, the gate will be locked a little later at 3:40pm to give you time to get there, run the mile then get back up to exit the site. We appreciate that on days when your child is in wrap around care or at another club you will not be able to do this but we hope there are other days in the week when you can. We trust you will take advantage of this offer if it appeals to you and that the children will benefit from the initiative.

#### **PTA News:**

We will hold a 'Coronation Parade' to judge and award prizes to the crowns that we hope your child will make and bring to school on the day, and as long as the weather is fine, we will have a picnic lunch on the field. We hope your child is enjoying the preparations for this event as it gets ever closer.

#### **School Dinners:**

Please note that next week, on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> May when we are celebrating the Coronation, there will be a slight change to the published lunch menu; a Coronation themed picnic lunch can be ordered so that the children having a school meal are not excluded.

#### Cake and Badge Sale:

On Friday 5th May three Year 5 boys will be organizing and running a cake sale to raise money for a project they are passionate about supporting. All proceeds from the sale of cakes and Hama bead badges that Monty has been making will go towards vital medical care for Jasmine, 'The Warrior Princess'. Sadly, Jasmine who is 7 years old has been diagnosed with a rare brain tumour. The location of the tumour makes an operation incredibly difficult and at best she only has about a year and a half to live. To help prolong her life she is currently undergoing radiotherapy but her parents are desperate to take her abroad to receive further treatment which might be more effective. A fund has been set up in her name to help raise the £250,000 needed for this to happen.

The boys would be incredibly grateful if you could get baking next week ready to send cakes in on Friday morning which they can sell after school on the playground. Fairy cakes or other individual cakes are preferable and please remember we are a nut-free school. Monty's badges will also be on sale so do arrive at pick up with money to spend!
