The ducklings, which Cygnets have named Daffodil, Daisy, Dandelion, Dizzy and Pecky, are perfectly happy in their new home and the children are looking after them brilliantly. Lots have been in to Cygnet Class to see them and we're all looking forward to next week when they take their first splash in our paddling pool.

We are incredibly grateful to you, who through our PTA, fund this project for us every year. It brings so many benefits and is a real highlight for many. We have Open House next week so if you are visiting other classes and would like to pop into Reception Class to see the ducklings, you are very welcome to do so.

The work we are doing towards this very special event in our school calendar is a unique way in which we enhance the learning experience for the children.

A Fabulous Visit to see Starlight Express:

Yesterday Year 4 had a wonderful time in London when they went to see 'Starlight Express'. It was spectacular! With lots of other trips coming up before the end of term, including Year 6's residential trip to Devon, do keep a look out for letters and emails and keep referring to the weekly newsletter, in particular the calendar below.

Planning these trips, and we have many in our school, take a huge amount of organising. A lot of work goes in to researching places and compiling the relevant paperwork but staff do it because we see how much these activities also enhance the learning experience for the children. They become a highlight of the year and something we hope the children remember long after they have left our school.

Year 5's Trip to Holy Trinity Church and Swan Upping:

Before the end of the academic year, Year 5 will be going out on a couple of local trips. You have already completed OA4 forms granting us permission to take them out so with no further consent to give, we will be visiting Holy Trinity Church on 22nd May and The Ferry on 15th July. On the afternoon of 15th July when we have been invited to see the Swan Upping, the team have advised us that the media will be there so they have asked that the children of any parents who do not wish them to be filmed or photographed should **not** be included in the party. Unfortunately, we cannot do anything about this request so **if you do not wish your child to attend, please inform us immediately.**

While there, the children will learn about this historic event and its significance in the past and the present day. They will be able to see very young cygnets at close hand and answer questions posed by The King's Swan Marker about swans, their ecology and the tradition of Swan Upping; we are hoping that as many of the class can go as possible.

Attendance:

This week the borough's Education Welfare Officer was in school to discuss the attendance of individual pupils. Attendance data will be published on end of year school reports with the aim of every child's attendance being above 95%, the target the Department of Education strives for. Research has shown that high attendance rates have a significant impact on attainment as pupils move through school, a fact that is perhaps obvious but is worth reiterating. Your support is essential in this. To guide you in supporting your child through their learning this term, staff have compiled class newsletters which have been sent out to you today. We hope you find these helpful in explaining what topics will be covered over the next few weeks. Assembly ended on a high today when over 60 children were presented with certificates for 100% attendance last term.

News from Miss Buckley about the 'Attachment Aware Schools' Award': How do we support children to meet their potential at Holy Trinity?

At Holy Trinity, alongside prioritising relationships, staff using emotion coaching techniques to help children reflect on their emotions in a healthy way, something which is essential for them to be in a state of 'learning readiness'. You can support us by using emotion coaching at home by practising the same principles and strategies to create consistency for your child. Here are some ways to do so:



children and young people may require more support with this than others; use visuals and offer

suggestions and choices where this helpful.

- Acknowledge Emotions: When your child expresses feelings, listen without judgement. Validate their emotions by saying things like, "I see you're feeling frustrated. That's okay, let's talk about it."
- 2. **Label Emotions:** Help your child identify and name their emotions, like saying, "It seems like you're feeling angry. Let's find out why."
- 3. **Model Calmness:** Show your child how to manage emotions by staying calm during stressful situations. Children learn by watching their parents.
- Problem-Solving: After acknowledging the emotion, guide your child to think about how they can handle it, such as suggesting ways to calm down or work through a difficult situation.
- 5. **Encourage Reflection:** After an emotional event, talk about what happened, what worked well, and what could be done differently next time.

By reinforcing emotion coaching at home, you can help your child develop emotional intelligence and resilience, supporting the learning happening at school.

learn alternative, prosocial ways to manage their feelings and emotions.

Smartphone Free Childhood:

You are perhaps aware from previous newsletters, that a number of our parents have been actively involved in promoting the Smartphone Free Childhood movement which aims to bring parents together to stand up for healthier, happier childhoods where our children are safeguarded from the harmful effects of being exposed to certain online material. When children first started getting smartphones a decade ago, there was no research about their impact. Now there is, and it's overwhelming. According to latest findings, exposing children to things their brains aren't yet developed enough to deal with can cause a whole host of problems from triggering anxiety and eating disorders to opening the door to cyberbullying or sexual predators. We have noticed this year how few children in Year 6 have mobile phones, and, as a result, we have also noticed a significant decrease in the number of issues caused by them. I am sure you know how toxic WhatApp and other messaging services can become, often providing a platform for negative material to be circulated. It leads to unhealthy dialogue that can affect us all.

Next week I will be attending a meeting with lots of other heads, primary and secondary, from across the area to discuss the issue. If anything further comes to light, I will share it with you. In the meantime, you might like to visit the Smartphone Free Childhood website Smartphone Free Childhood where you can find a link to the parent pact. Up until very recently, our school was at the top of the leaderboard of schools whose parents have signed up. We now sit in second place having been overtaken by another local school (Smartphone Free Childhood Parent Pact). Our reception parents are leading the way with 21 out of 30 having signed so if you support the message and are yet to make it clear, do find time to sign up. Thank you.
