## KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK

Again, another busy week has passed with a visit to Cygnet Class from our Community Police Officer and our gymnastics coach working with all classes across the school. We hope your child has spoken positively about the things they have been up to.

#### PTA Disco:

If your child is coming along to the PTA disco later I trust you have already bought a ticket and that they are looking forward to the party.

Arrangements are as follows **(please note a change in timings from the last time we had a disco in school):**

- **EYFS & KS1 - 4.45 – 6pm**
- **KS2 - 6.15 -7.30**

Children in EYFS and KS1 should arrive at 4:45pm at the front entrance.

**If your child is at Sewing Club or iPro football training you are required to pick up your child from the club and then bring them back to school at the appropriate time. WE ARE UNABLE TO SUPERVISE THEM IN SCHOOL BETWEEN THE CLUB FINISHING AND THE DISCO STARTING.**

**If your child is going to WrapAroundCare before the disco, please inform Nina and her team.**

**Children in EYFS and/or KS1 should be collected from the back door of the hall at 6:00pm.** We will be as quick as we can handing them over but it may take a little while. Thank you for your patience while we do this.

Once all the younger children have safely left, we will then open the doors at the front of school to allow KS2 children to come in. **They too should be collected from the back door of the hall at 7:30pm.**

We would be grateful if you could discourage your child from bringing unnecessary items with them which may get mislaid. **Please note, that the bringing of mobile phones is strictly prohibited and food items should not be brought either.** Thank you for your support.

#### PTA HT Fest:

Just as a reminder, your child is invited to enter the competition to design a front cover for this year's HT Fest programme. Please refer to the flyer sent out today for details. Their design should have a sport theme and be returned to school by Friday 6<sup>th</sup> February.

#### Smartphone Free Childhood:

No doubt you will have heard all the coverage in the media recently about the controversy over young people having access to mobile phones and in particular certain social media sites. Earlier in the week the Education Secretary, Bridget Phillipson, called for all schools to follow new government guidance and be phone-free for the entire school day. As you will know, we took the decision some months ago to join with many RBWM schools and impose a smartphone free ban at our school. We are enormously grateful for your support in helping us implement this. The children were never permitted to use their phones in school; they were locked away during the day and returned at home time. However, since we imposed the ban, the number of issues brought into school related to the use of mobile phones while at home has reduced to zero. We continue to teach the children about online safety and etiquette and trust that you do too but understanding the complexity of the problem makes it tricky for all of us to navigate our way through.

I share with you today a letter from the Headteacher of Newlands School outlining their stance on the matter and inviting parents of Year 6 girls to a meeting on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> June at 6:00pm to find out more. Do take a moment to read the attachment.

### Buckinghamshire Secondary School Transfer Tests:

If you have a child in Year 5, you may be considering a grammar school for when they leave Holy Trinity. This week, we have been informed that the Buckinghamshire Secondary Transfer test will take place on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> September 2026 (Practice) and Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> September 2026 (Transfer Test). As we are not in Buckinghamshire, if you wish your child to take the 11+ examination here or elsewhere you are required to register them for the test yourself. Please note that the timeframe for parents to register for the test has been shortened this year; the deadline will now be 2<sup>nd</sup> June (last year it was 13<sup>th</sup> June). The registration window opens on 1<sup>st</sup> May so do contact Buckinghamshire Council if this applies to you.

### Open House:

Finally, next week we invite you to another Open House to view your children's work, see their classroom and meet informally with their teacher(s). They run on Tuesday for KS2 and Wednesday for EYFS and KS1 from the end of the day to about 4pm. On Wednesday parents of children in Reception will have an opportunity to join a short workshop in which we will explain our approach to teaching early reading and share with you the resources we use.
