#### PTA School Disco:

I do hope your child is looking forward to this evening's PTA disco if they are coming along. The team will be waiting at the front entrance to sign them in.

Children in EYFS and KS1 should arrive at 4:30pm. If your child is at Sewing Club or iPro football training and you would like us to take them directly to the disco from the club, please inform the office immediately if you haven't already done so so we can be sure of which children to collect. If your child is going to WrapAroundCare first, please inform Emily and her team yourself.

Children in EYFS and/or KS1 should be collected from the back door of the hall at 5:50pm. We will be as quick as we can handing them over but it may take a little while. Thank you for your patience while we do this.

Once all the younger children have safely left, we will then open the doors at the front of school to allow KS2 children to come in. They too should be collected from the back door of the hall at 7:30pm.

We would be grateful if you could discourage your child from bringing unnecessary items with them which may get mislaid. **Please note, that the bringing of mobile phones is strictly prohibited.** Thank you for your help in making this a wonderful evening for the children.

### **News from the Week:**

We began this week with the news that in a national poll of young people, 'kindness' has been chosen as Children's Word of the Year for 2024. Kindness is something we speak a lot about in school and we see examples of it on a daily basis. It's been very evident this week as we've enjoyed hearing more about Paddington's adventures traveling in Ethiopia. You may have read in last week's newsletter about our latest project with Partners for Change Ethiopia. His adventures have really inspired the children who are keen to organise fund raising events to support the pupils in Tibase M Primary School. It's a school heavily affected by poverty, populated by children from many internally displace families so any money we raise will be used to provide them with breakfast and school materials. We are currently deciding how best to incorporate everyone's fund raising ideas, and there are many, into a whole school project during Lent.

In other news this week Year 6 have enjoyed welcoming Mr Redjeb back to the classroom after a period of paternity leave. He is grateful for all your kind messages of support and we are thrilled to have him back. The class have had a great week diving into the world of Philip Pullman's 'The Firework-Makers Daughter' and creating their own set of instructions for making fantastical fireworks. Their imagination has gone into over-drive. Led by Year 1's accurate weather forecasting, Year 2 have found dry days to go out and explore the school grounds ahead of writing a tour guide for visitors and Cygnet Class have focused on the Chinese New Year. Look out for their snake display that they've created for you ahead of Open House next week. Year 3 have continued their study of the skeleton and Year 5 have been designing and making pop-up books ready to share with Year 1 next week. They've learnt lots about different mechanisms including loose pivot levers and parallel sliders! With the Primary Dance Festival less than two weeks away, Year 4 have continued to work hard on perfecting their routine. Please refer to the email about costumes which was sent out yesterday. Aside from this the class have been considering the question, 'Are pilgrimages necessary for believers?' The focus has been on the Jewish faith with other religions tackled next week. It's been an interesting discussion for everyone.

The football team were disappointed that the match on Monday had to be postponed owing to unforeseen circumstances but our A and B netball squad were able to play their games against Courthouse yesterday.
