News from Miss Buckley about the 'Attachment Aware Schools' Award': How do we support children to meet their potential at Holy Trinity?



Every interaction is an intervention' (Karen Treisman)

This quote summarises our approach to building relationships with children, which is essential for them to be in a state of 'learning readiness'.

Every time you engage with your child, whether it's a conversation, a look, or even your body language, you're shaping their experience and learning. Every interaction, big or small, has an impact. For example, when you help them solve a problem, you're not just providing an answer, you're teaching them problem-solving skills. When you're listening to them, you're teaching them that their thoughts and feelings matter. Even when you're upset, the way you handle those emotions teaches them how to manage their own.

So, in essence, you have the power to guide their development through every moment you spend together. The key is being mindful of how you communicate and respond because these small, everyday moments can be powerful interventions in their growth.

As part of the work that our school has done towards achieving our Attachment Aware Schools Award, we have ensured all staff understand that consistency is important and we believe strongly that relationships are at the core of everything we do.
