The statutory Standard Attainment Tests which all children in Year 6 have to take during the summer term, begin next week. They run to a strict timetable with all exams taking place in the morning as follows:

On the morning of each exam, your child is invited to come to school from 8am to enjoy a healthy breakfast of fruit, yoghurt and pastries in the Yr. 6 classroom. The cost for breakfast each morning is £3; please send your child in with cash if they wish to attend.

Each day, once the tests are done, the papers will be collected up and sent away for marking. We expect to receive the results early July at which point we will share your child's results with you. Please refer to the letters emailed out to you earlier in the week.
