How do we support children to meet their potential at Holy Trinity?

As part of our journey towards becoming a Gold Award Attachment Aware School, we're sharing simple ways we support emotional wellbeing in school—and how you can help continue this support at home.

Restorative Approaches: Repairing Relationships and Building Responsibility



At Holy Trinity, we understand that relationships are at the heart of everything we do. We also know that sometimes, things go wrong—feelings get hurt, mistakes are made, or boundaries are crossed. When that happens, we don't simply focus on blame or punishment. Instead, we use restorative approaches to help children repair relationships and learn from the experience.

A restorative approach asks:



- What happened?
- How did it affect everyone involved?
- How can we make things right?
- What can we do differently next time?



This process encourages children to take responsibility with support, not shame. It helps them reflect on the impact of their actions, express their feelings safely, and think about how to move forward positively.

In school, this might look like:



Move Forward

- Calm, guided conversations after a disagreement on the playground.
- Time to listen to different perspectives with an adult present.
- Thinking together about a kind action or apology to help repair the relationship.

How you can support this at home:

- After a conflict, give everyone time to calm down—then gently explore what happened and how people felt.
- Ask questions like "How do you think your brother felt when that happened?" or "What could we do to put this right?"
- Avoid jumping to blame—instead, focus on learning and repair.
- Model apologising when you get things wrong too. This teaches children that it's okay to make mistakes—and that making amends is a sign of strength.

Restorative approaches help children develop empathy, accountability, and emotional maturity. They learn that relationships can be repaired, and that we all have the capacity to grow. By using these approaches both in school and at home, we can support our children not just to behave well, but to truly understand themselves and others—and that's a life skill far beyond the classroom.
