News from the Week:

The children have continued to explore the topics you will have read about in our January Class Newsletters. Year 5 have been busy perfecting their pop-up books which they were thrilled to share with Year 1 yesterday. The younger children were captured by their stories and the moveable pages which they had put together so well. Perhaps you have seen the snowdrops and daffodils starting to appear at the front of school but have you noticed the bird cakes which the Eco- Council made recently and which they hung on the tree outside my office? Cygnets were also out yesterday hanging the bird cakes they had made down in our wildlife area. We have prepared a positive feast for the birds this weekend! Year 6 have now concluded their work on the artist David Hockney who happened to be in the news this week. They have been engrossed in creating mood boards and landscapes to great effect. Thank you for your support this week as we've implemented new arrangements for clubs which meet before school. Spanish and Maths Club coming through the front door and Netball Club entering through the side gate have meant that children in Early Bird Club have not been disturbed by others walking through the hall. It has created a more conducive atmosphere.

Last week I informed you that in order to ensure fairness and parity across all, the administration of the choir was being brought in line with our other club providers. For many years school has funded the choir but this is now no longer possible. For clubs that incur no cost to the school like Mr Whittles's Football Club, Ukelele Club, Hand Chime Club, Mr Lucas' Netball Club and Maths Club run by Mrs Neal and her team, there is no cost to join but when it comes to outside providers, we are not in a position to swallow the fees they charge. Our aim is to give the children as many extra-curricular opportunities as we can so we don't wish to restrict what is on offer but in order to do this we have no other choice than to pass the cost on. This is the situation with choir. It is not a decision we took lightly so we hope we can rely on your understanding and support. Thank you.
