

KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK

I can't start this week's newsletter with writing about anything other than last Sunday's Cookham VE Day picnic. What a magnificent event! I hope that those of you who were able to go along enjoyed it as much as I did. Enormous thanks go to the Cookham Village Events Committee, who, steered by Kate Winrow-Davies, did a superb job bringing everyone together and giving so many children a platform on which to shine. Our choir did a wonderful job entertaining the crowds with a medley of World War 2 songs and the eighty plus children who danced to 'Don't Sit Under the Apple Tree' were spectacular. It was a joy to be part of such a special event.

Celebrating VE Day in School:

Yesterday, the children looked fantastic dressed up in 1940s clothing and the school looked magnificent decked with bunting. Thanks to your fundraising through the PTA, we were able to invite the company 'As Creatives' into school to help us think more deeply about aspects of VE Day. The team whose vision is to improve the future of children by enhancing learning experiences through activities that place creativity at the heart of curriculum learning, took us on a journey discovering everything there is to know about the end of the war. We began with a whole school assembly then each class took part in a workshop with a particular theme. We found out what people wore, how they travelled to big centres including London where parties were happening, what they ate and how the Royal Family joined in. We also used the information boards which you may have seen on Sunday to find out about how people in Cookham were affected by the war and we observed the two minutes silence at noon. Year 6 ended the day considering what people hoped the world would look like after VE Day and whether those dreams came true. It was a poignant way to finish. Lots of pictures were posted on our social media site X for you to enjoy.

In assemblies leading up to the event, we have all focused on the importance of marking this very special anniversary and considered what peace means to us now and how we can have a positive impact on ensuring that values like respect, cooperation and kindness prevent conflict. It has been a through-provoking week which we hope the children will remember and look back on with fond memories. Thank you for helping us to make the week special for all.

News from Miss Buckley about the 'Attachment Aware Schools' Award': How do we support children to meet their potential at Holy Trinity?

As part of our journey towards becoming a Gold Award Attachment Aware School, we're sharing simple ways we support emotional wellbeing in school—and how you can help continue this support at home.



Consistency and Predictability – At School and at Home

At Holy Trinity, we know that **children feel safest when their world feels consistent and predictable**. That sense of security helps them manage their emotions, focus their attention, and feel confident enough to learn.

In school, this looks like:

- Clear daily routines and visual timetables.
- Consistent adult responses to behaviour—calm, fair, and kind.
- Shared language around feelings and behaviour expectations.

We aim to provide a calm, structured environment where children know what to expect and what's expected of them. This sense of emotional safety helps them feel grounded and ready to engage with their learning.

How you can support this at home:

- Stick to routines as much as possible—bedtimes, mealtimes, or even a simple "getting ready for school" checklist can give your child structure and reassurance.
- **Talk through what's coming up**—for example, "After tea, we'll have a bit of playtime and then start getting ready for bed." Knowing what's next reduces anxiety.
- Use consistent responses to behaviour—this helps your child know where the boundaries are and gives them a sense of fairness.
- Stay calm and clear in moments of stress—when adults model calmness and consistency, children feel safer and more able to self-regulate.

You don't need to follow a rigid schedule—just having a rhythm and tone that your child can rely on helps create the stability they need to flourish.

Secondary Transfer Test (11 Plus):

As a partner school working with Buckinghamshire Council, we have authority to carry out and invigilate transfer tests here in school. In reaching the qualifying mark in these tests, children gain entry to a grammar school. However, in order for your child to take the tests you have to complete the registration process yourself. It went live last Friday. Smartphone Free Childhood:

I hope you saw the information I shared in last week's newsletter about our support of a Smartphone Free Childhood. I am delighted to inform you that after slipping to second place in the leader board of schools in Berkshire whose parents have signed the Smartphone Free Childhood Parent Pact we are now back up in the top spot thanks to several more of you signing up. Thank you.

This morning I was at a meeting with head teachers from sixty schools all committed to taking collective action to make RBWM a Smartphone Free borough. The reason this campaign is gaining momentum is down to the recent research that has been carried out, all of which points to the negative impact Smartphones can have on our children. The key factors are: harmful content, addiction, academic distraction, grooming, cyberbullying, mental illness and 'opportunity cost'. To find out more about what research has unearthed on these specific areas, please refer to the leaflet that has been sent to you today as an attachment. If you are yet to sign the pact and would like to show your support for the campaign, go to Sign the Berkshire Parent Pact Firmly believing in this campaign and anxious to protect our young people, I am proud to be back up at the top of the leader board and would like to stay there.
