Arts and Culture Week:

You will be aware that our Arts and Culture Week is scheduled for next week. As you will have seen on previous newsletters, on the afternoon of Friday 16th June, you are invited to come into school to see our performance in celebration of the arts. Each class will be presenting a routine and our show will end with a whole school number. We do hope you will be able to come along. Your child will need a basic costume consisting of a plain black t-shirt and plain black shorts with specific costume embellishments which you will find posted on Google Classroom. Mrs Lucas has been working incredibly hard with almost every class in the school choreographing some amazing dances and we have enjoyed welcoming the borough's dance specialist, Jane Douglass, to Holy Trinity. Mrs Douglass, who has had input into the Year 3 and Year 6 dances, was in school again this week perfecting their routines.

On Friday your child should come to school wearing their costume which they will stay in for the whole day. You are invited to arrive from 1:30pm ready to make your way down to the field where our performance will take place starting at 1:45pm. After our show, the children will return to class from where you will be able to sign them out before taking them home. KS1 & KS2 children will leave with you as normal via the back gate, EYFS will exit via the front entrance.

If you are unable to come and if our performance ends a little before 3:15pm, your child will be supervised by staff until usual pick up time when you should arrive as normal at the back gate (KS1 & KS2) or the front entrance (EYFS) to collect them.

Next week the children will be practising their dance performance outside so it would be ever so helpful if you could ensure they come to school wearing sunscreen every day. It looks as if the weather will be on our side! They should also come in each day wearing smart school P.E. kit regardless of whether they have a P.E. lesson.

In celebration of Arts and Culture, on Monday 12th June we will launch the week with 'Rogue Opera', a profession music company who will perform a range of pieces all with the intention of inspiring the children through live music. For the rest of the week a number of workshops, including some delivered by Norden Farm, have been planned but we would still welcome your input!
