



## KEY INFORMATION FOR THE WEEK

You may well be aware of the recently launched UK-wide NSPCC's television advertising campaign highlighting how one in five children in the UK have experienced abuse and neglect. As part of our safeguarding programme, this week we invited the NSPCC into school to deliver their primary school programme. In two assemblies, one to Foundation Stage and KS1, the other to KS2, two volunteers from the charity spoke to the children about how to stay safe and who to turn to if they have any worries. Your child will have brought home a leaflet outlining what was covered. To support the work carried out by the charity we will be holding a sponsored event, 'Super Circuits', in school in the next couple of weeks for which your child is invited to collect sponsors. The form and any sponsor money collected should be returned to school by Friday 5<sup>th</sup> October. Please see the sponsor form for more details.

On Friday (28<sup>th</sup> September) we will be supporting Macmillan with a cake sale after school on the back playground. We would be grateful for any cake donations which can be dropped off at the office on Friday morning. Please be sure that the cakes do not contain any traces of nuts.

This week the photographer was in school. If you wish to purchase your child's photograph you will have received an access code card on Friday (in book bags) which details how you order on line. The images will be uploaded to the companies secure website which you will need to use your login to access. If you order within a limited time frame postage is free as photographs will be delivered to school for your child to take home.

This week, if you have a child in Reception to Year 5, a pack was circulated, (by email) offering information about the seasonal influenza vaccination (nasal spray) which will be offered to your children in December. Consent forms and further details will be issued later in the term.

Clubs are now up and running. Mrs. Laraine Brown is keen to recruit more to her Junior and Senior Choir which meet before school at 8am, Junior Choir on Tuesday and Senior Choir on Thursday. Please see the attached flyer for more details.

Please be aware that the school office closes as 4pm. Beyond this time, if for instance you are collecting your child after a club has finished, please drop any forms or other documentation into the white post box at the front entrance. This can be used in the morning too. It is emptied on a daily basis.

Let me remind you that the staff car park should not be used as a drop off point for children nor should children be entering the car park at any stage. Please also be aware of not leaving your dog tied up between parked cars; they are difficult to spot by staff leaving the site in their vehicles.

Finally, from time to time school seeks the views of parents. If you have a need for an after school club beyond the hours clubs currently operate we would be interested to understand your requirements and ascertain how much you would be willing to pay for such a provision.
